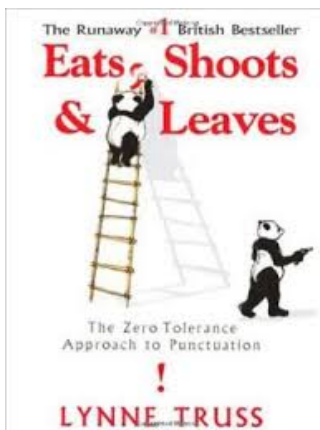


# How Humor & Creativity Add Spark to A Dry Topic
